## **Acknowledgment Certificates**

When you perform an acknowledgment on a document that will be filed in California, your state laws require you to complete an acknowledgment certificate that is worded exactly as it appears in statute. That certificate, known as the California All-Purpose Acknowledgment, is shown below.

A notary public or other officer completing this certificate verifies only the identity of the individual who signed the document to which this certificate is attached, and not the truthfulness, accuracy, or validity of that document.

For documents that will be filed *outside* California, you may use other acknowledgment certificates. The certificate cannot, however, require you to certify anything California law doesn't allow you to. This includes certifying that the signer has the authority to sign as the representative of an organization or another person.

An acknowledgment certificate must be written in English.

## **Jurat Certificates**

When you perform a jurat, your state laws require you to complete a jurat certificate that is worded exactly as it appears in statute. That certificate is shown below.

A notary public or other officer completing this certificate verifies only the identity of the individual who signed the document to which this certificate is attached, and not the truthfulness, accuracy, or validity of that document.
